

As we continue to push the boundaries of interdisciplinary research, 2024 marked another significant milestone for IAST, with the full establishment of the department of Social and Behavioral Science at TSE. When the decision to create the department was made in 2023, everything was still in flux, as its structure, governance and longterm vision had yet to be defined. Over the past year, those foundations have been put in place, turning an ambitious idea into a fully operational academic home for interdisciplinary research. Together with our faculty, our staff, the wise members of our Scientific Council and Executive Board, and more than a hundred exceptional Research Fellows, we had proven that it was possible to build a world-class interdisciplinary research environment in Toulouse. This jewel has now taken its rightful place in the TSE crown.

This transformation has reinforced our commitment to shaping the future of TSE and will allow us to accelerate our growth even further. Indeed, just this year, we strengthened our position as a global hub for quantitative social sciences and behavioral research, by integrating new faculty in psychology, sociology, and computational social science. But while IAST takes pride in the SBS Department, it remains, and will always be, a force for change in its own right. If SBS is where ideas take root, IAST is where they are first dreamt of. The department provides the structure and stability needed for longterm growth, while IAST remains a space for exploration, where bold ideas are tested, and unexpected connections are made. Our scientific activities remained as dynamic as ever, with many conferences, workshops, seminars, and distinguished visitors. The richness of this intellectual life can be overwhelming: it would take 48-hour days

to attend every event and engage with every visitor! But this is the essence of IAST: an unparalleled intellectual menu, designed to expose scholars to ideas and perspectives they would never encounter elsewhere.

Governance at IAST also evolved this year, as I followed in the footsteps of Paul Seabright and Ingela Alger to become director of IAST. I am deeply grateful to my predecessors for paving the way, to my colleagues for their unfailing support as I stepped into this new role, and perhaps most of all, to the IAST staff for their tireless dedication to our institution. With a firm foundation in place, IAST will continue to innovate. Our commitment to interdisciplinary excellence remains unwavering, and we look forward to another year of discovery, collaboration, and growth in the place we cherish.


IAST GOVERNANCE


IAST is a sheltered foundation under the aegis of the Jean-Jacques Laffont - TSE Foundation. IAST has a Scientific Council composed of 25 members and is governed by an Executive Committee (COMEX) with representatives of the Toulouse Capitole University, the Jean-Jacques Laffont - TSE Foundation including a representative of IAST researchers, the collegium of public partners, and the collegium of economic partners. Ingela Alger was the IAST Director until August 2024. Her successor, Jean-François Bonnefon, took office as the new Director of IAST, and of the Department of Social and Behavioral Sciences (SBS) in September. Previously, he served as Scientific Director until February 2023, before being succeeded by Jonathan Stieglitz, who took office in March 2023.


François Bourguignon (Director of research emeritus at EHESS, former Chief Economist & Senior Vice President of the World Bank in Washington and former Director of Paris School of Economics) is the chairman of the IAST

Executive Committee, helping develop IAST alongside its mother institution, the internationally renowned Toulouse School of Economics (TSE).

The Institute for Advanced Study in Toulouse is a unified scientific project whose broad aim is to study human behavior through an innovative and multidisciplinary approach to social science. Our Institute is home to a team of resident full-time researchers from leading universities worldwide. While most researchers preferentially use analytical and quantitative methods to address their scientific questions, some researchers combine qualitative and quantitative methods, while others rely on qualitative methods. The Institute welcomes a large network of visitors from >25 countries, and partners with economists and mathematicians at the Toulouse Capitole University, INRAE, CNRS and the Toulouse School of Economics.







One **Professor**, **two assistant** professors and five post-doctoral IAST Research Fellows were recruited from September 2024, either fully funded by IAST or co-funded with the Grand Établissement Toulouse School of Economics and Quantitative Social Sciences. The newcomers all work at the crossroads of disciplines and are already developing exciting new interdisciplinary research projects in Toulouse.






LEADERSHIP, POWER AND INEQUALITY




EVOLUTION OF TECHNOLOGY

MAXIME DEREX (GROUP LEADER)

The IAST Research Team on the Evolution of Technology aims to encourage collaboration on topics related to the evolution of technology, broadly defined as those techniques, skills, methods, and processes used in the production of products or services or in the accomplishment of objectives. The team seeks to improve our understanding of the evolution of technology over short, long, and very long-time scales and its implications

for human biological and cultural evolution. It addresses questions such as: Which sets of biological traits and social structures allow humans to develop increasingly complex technologies? Which environmental and social conditions are especially conducive to the evolution of technology? How has technology affected our biology, and the way we think? How does it affect our use of time, space, and natural resources? Our interdisciplinary research leverages collaborations between biologists, economists, psychologists and anthropologists and incorporates a variety of methods, such as mathematical models, experiments and ethnographic studies.





CREATION OF THE SBS DEPARTEMENT

The creation of the Social and Behavioral Sciences (SBS)
Department marks a pivotal moment in the evolution of the Toulouse School of Economics (TSE) into the Toulouse School of Economics and Quantitative Social Sciences.

This department cements the long-term presence of interdisciplinary research at TSE, ensuring stability and strategic growth. Yet, it is IAST that continues to be the beating heart of this transformation, fostering high-volume scientific life through an intensive program of seminars, visiting scholars, conferences, and seed funding for bold interdisciplinary expeditions.

Building a department that successfully integrates anthropology, biology, economics, political science, psychology, and sociology is an extraordinary challenge. In a period of growth, when each discipline may have only a handful of permanent faculty, maintaining intellectual diversity without fragmentation is a balancing act. It requires us to create a shared identity that transcends disciplinary cultures, bridge methodological divides, and attract top

talents willing to take the risk of engaging in a genuine interdisciplinary career.

In this respect, the role of IAST's extends beyond its intellectual incubator function: it also serves as a key institutional player, leveraging its remarkable network of alumni and friends. Former visitors, past and present members of its Scientific Advisory Council, and IAST-trained researchers now in top institutions worldwide create an unparalleled network of expertise and influence that continues to shape and strengthen the SBS Department. As the SBS Department takes root, IAST will remain indispensable, not just as a source of interdisciplinary dynamism, but as the intellectual and institutional bridge that makes this ambitious transformation possible.
